Programs

HALFWAY HOUSE

The Halfway House program provides services to adults whose lives are impacted by chronic chemical dependency, assisting them to integrate into the workforce, establish necessary support networks, maintain abstinence, improve self-esteem, and reach their highest potential for independence and personal responsibility.

SHORT-TERM RESIDENTIAL

Touchstone provides comprehensive residential treatment promoting recovery, wellness, and productive lifestyle changes for individuals with substance dependency issues and related problems. Touchstone is dedicated to assisting people who may be experiencing problems related to co-existing mental health problems. *Touchstone is a collaboration between Houses of Hope and CenterPointe.*

INTENSIVE CASE MANAGEMENT & EMERGENCY/CRISIS RESPONSE

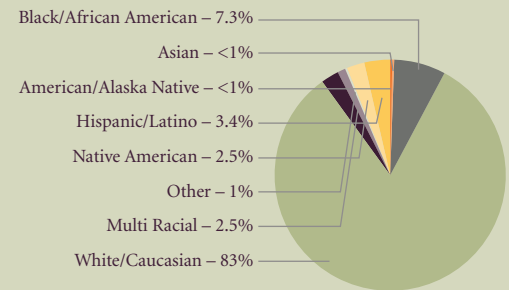

Mission

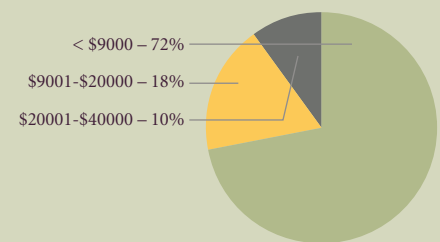
Houses of Hope provides affordable residential treatment and support services for individuals in recovery from substance dependence.

Client Demographics

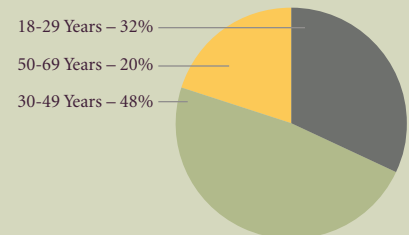
RACE / ETHNICITY



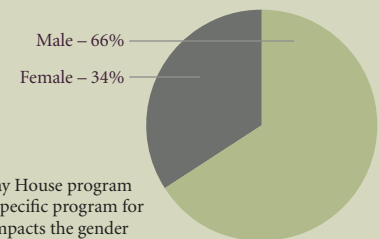
INCOME for year prior to treatment

History



Founded in 1962, Houses of Hope was the first halfway house facility in Nebraska. It originally opened to serve men who had completed treatment at the Hastings Regional Center in Lincoln. Since that time, Houses of Hope has provided continuous services to persons in recovery from chemical dependency, offering these individuals the opportunity for integration back into the community. Today, Houses of Hope offers the only licensed halfway house services in a 16-county area.

Over the years we have grown—In 1999, we opened Touchstone as a collaboration with CenterPointe. Due to demand and quality of services offered we have been able to expand services at Touchstone.

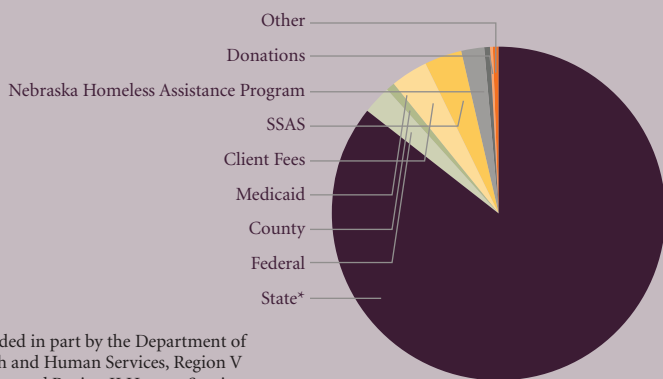
In 2004 we piloted a project for Region V Systems, Intensive Care Management, which has grown substantially since its humble beginnings—and is now the TASC program. TASC operates in collaboration with other partners (listed above) and has grown from serving 10 clients, to several hundred a year.
