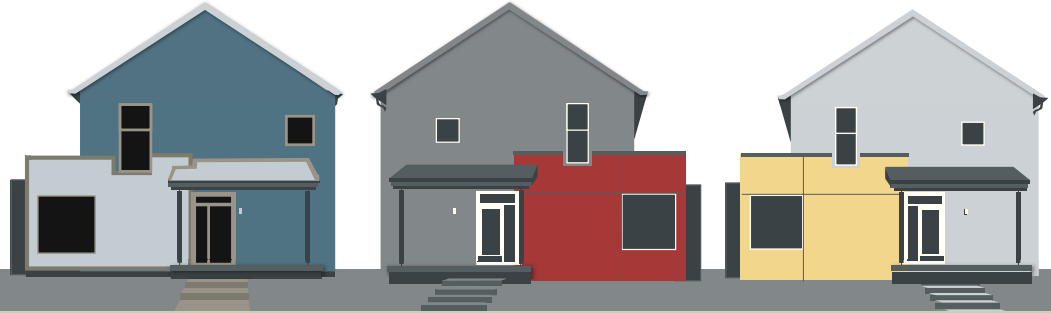




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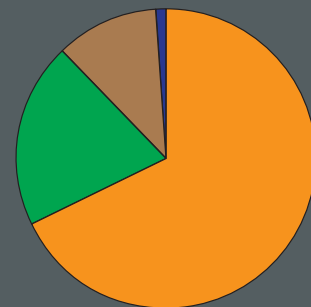


Building Better Lives in Recovery

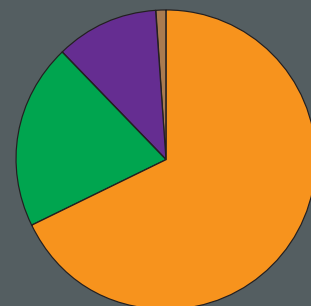
AGENCY REVENUE: \$3,423,311

Although Houses of Hope is known for our halfway houses, we are much more than just one program. Our three programs reach men and women throughout our community, addressing substance use and mental health issues, as well as offering a chance for a new life for individuals in recovery. Houses of Hope offers the chance to change, live a healthy life, and do so with the clinical and social supports so clearly needed during these challenging times.

For over 50 years, Houses of Hope has been proud of our mission to provide affordable residential treatment and support service for individuals in recovery from substance use and related mental health issues.

Houses of Hope programs are funded in part with State and Federal Block Grant funds, the Department of Health and Human Services, Region V Systems and Region II Human Services. Additional funding sources: Lincoln-Lancaster County Joint Budget Committee, Nebraska Homeless Assistance Program, foundations, private donors and client fees.

PROGRAMS

Touchstone assists people experiencing problems related to co-existing substance use and mental health issues. While in treatment, consumers are assessed for their behavioral health needs and will experience an improved level of understanding of their condition and an improvement in their self-reliance. *Touchstone is a collaboration between Houses of Hope and CenterPointe.*

Halfway House - Lack of a stable, alcohol and drug-free living environment can derail recovery for even the most highly motivated individuals. The men's halfway house treatment program narrows the focus, allowing for a more precise and individual approach to address issues and situations that are unique to men in early recovery.

TASC - (Intensive Case Management & Emergency/Crisis Response), provides services in home communities and environment. Houses of Hope works with each individual and his/her support system to develop service goals that aide in improving overall quality of life. *TASC is a collaboration between Houses of Hope, Blue Valley Behavioral Health, Lutheran Family Services and The Bridge Behavioral Health.*

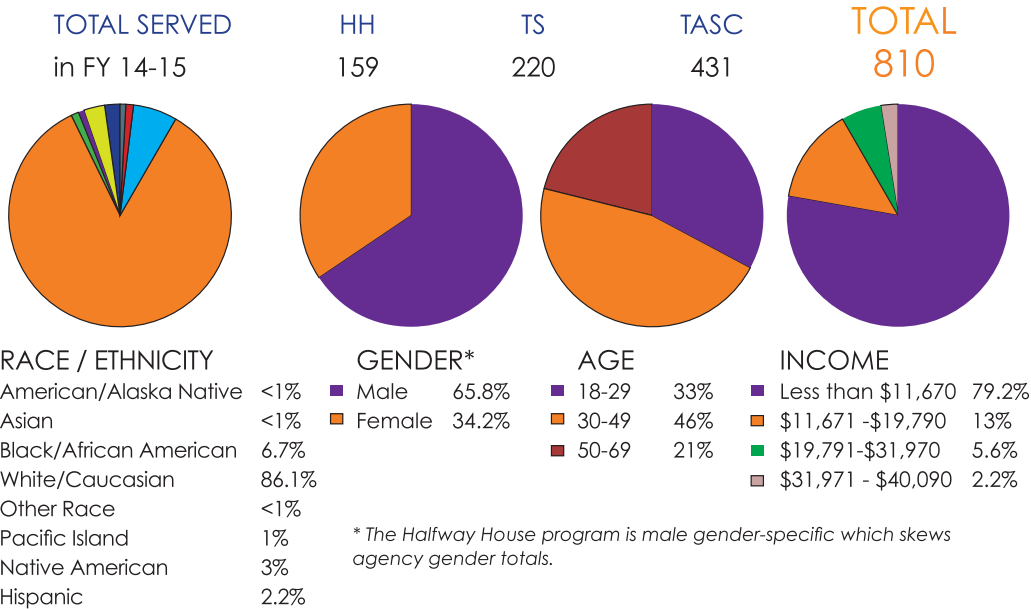
