Short-Term Residential Adult Substance Use Disorder Treatment

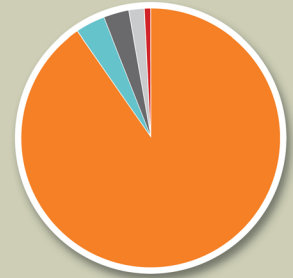
Alumni Group and 12-step self-help groups meet weekly at the Houses of Hope office.

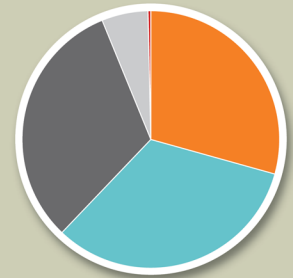

PROGRAM EXPENSES

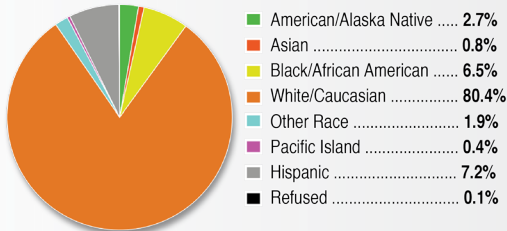

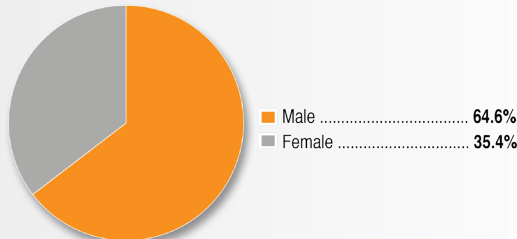

RACE / ETHNICITY

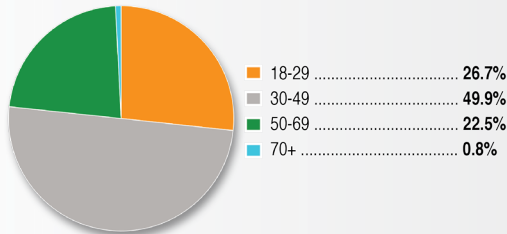


* GENDER

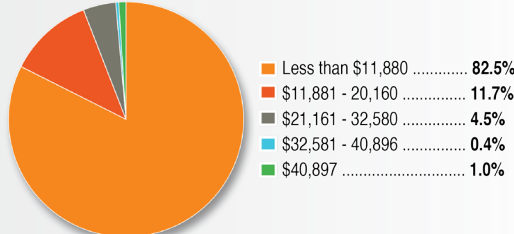
